Most of the following items relate to the solicitors who made up the practices of Howell, Jones and Howell, later Howell, Jones and Yearsley, and to their clients. The firm was established by Abraham Howell (1810-93), a son of William and Elinor Howell of Bont, Llanbryn-mair, who came to Welshpool c.1833. He joined the firm of Jones and Parry and became a solicitor in 1840; the firm later became recast as Howell, Jones and Yearsley but was dissolved in 1848 on the death of Joseph Jones. Abraham Howell subsequently established his own practice with his brother-in-law Edward Jones and, to judge from the records, W. Pryce Yearsley (died 1871). Howell later added his sons William Mark Howell and Charles Edward Howell. Abraham Howell married Mary Jones, a daughter of Edward Purcell Jones of Newtown, and served as County Treasurer, as JP from 1874, and as Mayor of Welshpool 1848, 1860, 1861 and 1869. Howell's original partner Edward Jones (1830-1900) became a solicitor in 1856. He was a son of Edward Purcell Jones of Newtown and served as town clerk for Welshpool and clerk of the Urban Sanitary Authority from 1866. (Obituary in *Bye-Gones*, 15 August 1900).

Charles Edward Howell (1846-1906) was Abraham Howell's second son. He became a solicitor in 1868 and joined the firm. He served as Mayor of Welshpool in 1894. (*Montgomeryshire Collections*, XXXIV, pp.268-70)
