This collection was transferred from Powysland Museum in 1994. It contains a number of diaries, some of which have possibly been identified. Also there is a small collection relating to Welshpool Dispensary and a series of parish magazines from Llanfyllin.

/D***Diaries of Douglas Onslow***

These diaries have been tentatively identified as belonging to Douglas Arthur Onslow. He frequently mentions "Caroline" who was possibly his wife. He also makes brief references to collieries, engineering works and so on. Inside the 1871 diary he gives his address as New Lodge, Burry Port, South Wales.

On the 1881 census there is a Douglas Arthur Onslow living at 14 Waverley Place, St Marylebone, London. He is 45 and born at Grichinopoly Hinduter, Ireland. His occupation is recorded at Justice of the Peace for the County of Carmarthen. His wife is Caroline Isabella, aged 43. His children, three of which are born at Pembrey, Carmarthen are Caroline, Catherine, Arthur and Francis. The diaries have been transferred to the Archives from Powysland Museum. As yet a connection, if any, with Montgomeryshire has not been established. The entries are very detailed and describe the weather, day to day activities and so on. They are also in a very fragile condition.

/W ***Welshpool Dispensary***

Welshpool dispensary opened in an old woollen warehouse in New Street in 1827. It was a building in which poor people could visit a doctor. In 1849 the upper rooms were used as an emergency hospital during the cholera epidemic. See M/X/28 for deeds relating to Welshpool Dispensary
