It will be noticed that Order Books are missing after M/Q/SO/2, 3 and 10. Both M/Q/SO/4 and 5 have suffered from damp and have lost leaves at the beginning of the book. M/Q/SO/3 is the only book with an index. M/Q/SO/3 also has bound to it, printed rules of practice of the court. For the gap 1864 - 1870 the searcher should consult M/Q/CX/2, a volume of extracts.

From 1857 J the particulars of indictments are recorded in a separate book; M/Q/SM/2, M/Q/SM/3 and 4 are minute books of indictments only.

Administrative Records

Much of the content of the bundles described under M/Q/A one might expect to find classified according to various Quarter Sessions committees, and various officials; notably the Clerk of the Peace, County Treasurer and County Surveyor. No evidence of such an arrangement survived. Most of the papers were found loose and the few remaining bundles showed arrangement by subject matter. The arrangement given and represented below is likewise by subject. It is similar to that adopted by many published guides to Quarter Sessions records.

BRIDGES

Several large rivers crossed the county so bridges were of particular importance in Montgomeryshire. There is much information on bridges in M/Q/SR and M/Q/SO besides M/Q/AB. MQ/CX/2 is also extremely useful for the period 1848-96. Bundles M/Q/AB/6-11 include County Surveyor's reports. These are mainly, often solely, concerned with bridges; some however, relate to roads, the county gaol, lock-ups and the military depot. (see plans).

/AG**COUNTY GAOL**

Something of the early history of the county house of correction and county gaol is to be found in a case relating to the possession of the old house of correction at Welshpool in M/Q/SR 1761 M. It appears that the house of correction at Welshpool was established in 1711 and a new county gaol built at Montgomery in 1735. M/Q/SR 1774 E includes a survey of the gaol. M/Q/SR 1787 M includes an estimate for improvements. A new county gaol was built in 18__.

/AH**HIGHWAYS**

A Highways was set up in 1864 to consider the implementation of the Highway Acts of 1862 and 1864. A scheme was approved in 1874, the county divided into highway districts and Highway Boards set up, see M/H/F and M/H/N (Highways) for their surviving records. There is a small amount of material relating to highways in M/Q/AB. For Turnpike Trusts see M/T.

Financial Records

For the period before 1828 the searcher must depend mainly on M/Q/SO which provides a record of orders for payment and also M/Q/SR in which will be found Treasurer's quarterly accounts and vouchers, though by no means regularly. In 1826 two committees were set up, one to audit the Treasurer's accounts, the other to report on them. A year later these duties were given to a single auditing committee. At 1827 M Richard Griffiths was appointed County Treasurer, on the death of Thomas Johnes. The more orderly record-keeping beginning in 1828 reflects these changes. An important note pasted inside the cover of M/Q/FA 1 tells us something of the pre-1828 financial records. It records that the accounts and vouchers to the end of 1807 were 'inside the Sessions Rolls', i.e. M/Q/SR; the vouchers for 1808-1804 were in separate bundles, cf M/Q/Fav; some accounts for 1808-14 were 'upon the files', i.e. M/Q/SR again, and the rest 'put together in a bundle', a bundle which does not survive. The note records other details not given here.

There is some evidence that the Treasurer's vouchers and perhaps his quarterly accounts were made up as bundles or files wrapped within the sessions roll, witness the occasional endorsement 'Treasurer's vouchers'. The main expenses of the early period are relief of vagrants by pass by petty constables, prosecutions, bridges and the gaol. The earliest printed Treasurer's annual account occurs in M/Q/SR 1783 J. Reports of the County Finance Committee will be found in M/Q/SR, and a few in M/Q/AB and M/Q/AH. Some mortgages on county rates will be found in M/Q/AB and M/Q/AL/3. It is worth pointing out that M/Q/FA and Q/FAg are valuable not simply as a financial record and record of administering county bridges, gaol etc. They also constitute the most quickly accessible record relating to the criminal jurisdiction of Quarter Sessions: they list the summary convictions, prosecutions, convicts transported, giving names, offences and sentences.

/FA GENERAL AUDIT BOOKS

These contain the audited quarterly accounts. They are copies of the series represented by M/Q/Faq. The foliation of M/Q/FA/2 runs 1179-1548. This suggests that there existed three preceding volumes of similar size, no doubt covering the period 1835-1867

The parishes in which these lands lie are named in the declarations. Rolled with the declarations are membranes with signatures to the oath of allegiance and the 'justices oath'. M/Q/JQ/3 also includes writs of 'dedimus potestatem' for administration of the oath. M/Q/JQ/4 contains oaths of allegiance and 'justices oaths' only.

The Clerk of the Peace was of course involved in the keeping of all classes of records of Quarter Sessions. What is classed under M/Q/C are the purely administrative papers which do not fit conveniently under any other head. Most of what is described under M/Q/A might equally well have come under M/Q/C.

M/T***Turnpike Trusts***

For an account of the several turnpike trusts in Montgomeryshire see Mont. Coll.LVII, pp. 2-16. Of only one of the Districts of these trusts have the records survived in official custody; the second District of the Bishops Castle Trust, also known as the Montgomery Second District. These were no doubt preserved by the accident of G D Harrison, (also Clerk of the Peace), being clerk to the trustees at the termination of the Trust in 1876.

For other records relating to turnpike trusts, see class M/Q/CT and M/Q/AH/5. For a substantial group of records of the Montgomeryshire First District see the Powysland Club deposit in the National Library of Wales, (Annual Report 1966, pp. 57-8 and 1967, p.57).The last of the Montgomeryshire Trusts expired in 1885, c.f. M/Q/AH 5.

MONTGOMERY SECOND DISTRICT TRUST

The 'Bishops Castle Act' by which the Trust was established was passed in 1768. The Second District was responsible for the Montgomery-Westbury road and other roads in the vicinity of Montgomery. The Trust was re-organised with increased powers by an Act of 1822. It came to an end in 1876
